Worked in cream, beige and caramel threads on a linen ground, surrounded by embroidered motto 'Take time while time is; for time will away ~ ' and monogram MMF, needlework 17.7cm x 17.7cm, in a faux tortoiseshell frame, glazed.

Provenance: worked by Mrs M Foster, Bath and by descent through the Ismay family (a relation to J. Bruce Ismay, Chairman of the White Star Line and aboard the Titanic). Exhibited Medici Galleries, London, 1934.
